The project will focus on working with migrant Youth Groups in the partner countries, which are made up of young people from the partner country, the EU and third country nationals. Using Restorative Practice, the young people will be facilitated to explore the EU's Action Plan on the Integration of Third-Country Nationals and the EU Migrant Policy. After examining these policies, the young people will identify key issues which affect them as young migrants and make recommendations for future policies. The young people will become reflective, critical citizens and actively contribute to the decisions being made. They will be given a voice to communicate their recommendations to other young people in partner countries and to policy makers locally (MEP's, national Government representatives, key civil servants etc.).
