Short overview of your organisation (key activ- ities, experience)	LWL is a dynamic social enterprise linking women with the resources to make their community safe and equal. LWL identifies and addresses key ine- qualities that prevent women in Longford achieving full social/ economic potential. We provide women- centred services (Childcare, DV, Counselling, Train- ing, Female Entrepreneurship), capacity-building and local/national advocacy. Longford Women's Manifesto Group (LWMG) is a flagship project of Longford Women's Link (LWL), a rural-based wom- en's social enterprise in Longford, Ireland. LWMG is based on a model of positive engagement between women and local decision-makers. While women are actively involved in a range of organisations at a community level, for many reasons they are not engaged politically at a local level. LWMG supports women to engage with local gov- ernment structures in order to bring women's voic- es and perspectives to decision-making tables, as well as advocating for greater citizen engagement in rural areas.
